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TABLE A: 2023 CERTIFICATES OF GOOD PRACTICE

Every year, our agency evaluates each of our 39 counties against a uniform set of engineering, maintenance, safety, financial, technical and administrative practices collectively known as the Standards of Good Practice. By staying in compliance with the standards and legislative directives, counties are eligible to receive funding from Motor Vehicle Fuel tax direct distributions, the County Aterial Preservation Program (CAPP) and the Rural Arterial Program (RAP). Additional notes on the current year's certifications can be found in the annual report.

TABLE D: 2023 ROAD LEVY SUMMARY

This information is provided in order to show annually the available local property tax (road levy) resources available to each county and the local decisions made annually that decrease those resources made available for county road purposes. Decreases are made by road levy diversions, a board resolution that diverts tax dollars to the current expense fund, and road levy shifts, which transfer revenue capacity from the county road levy to the current expense levy as a part of the annual levy of taxes. Currently, road levy diversions can only be used for traffic law enforcement purposes in order to maintain Rural Aterial Program (RAP) eligibility.

TABLE E: 2022 COUNTY ROAD MILEAGE

County roads are quite diverse: they span rural and urban environments, serve different traffic purposes and are constructed in a variety of ways depending on usage. Part of the counties' portion of the Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax distribution is calculated based on road data and characteristics that are submitted by the counties and certified by our agency annually. Currently, local access roads and unpaved roads are ineligible for funding through our programs.

The Washington Bridge Inventory includes structures over 20.0 feet long or culverts greater than 20.0 feet in width. Bridges under 20 feet are ineligible for federal funding and are not included in the Washington State Bridge Inventory System. Bridge condition is calculated on a scale of 0 (out of service/beyond corrective action) to 9 (excellent) based on the lowest rating of the bridge's substructure, superstructure, deck and culvert.
